basic overhead. Thank you all!

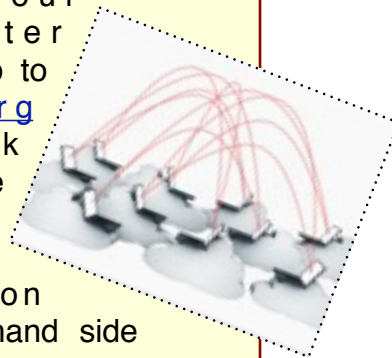
The tote bags have arrived and are quite handsome! We've been getting them out to all of you who became members at or above the \$60 level.
